#### **Parish News**

#### Friends,

The papal intention this past month was "for a shared mission, that the Church continue to sustain in all ways a Synodal lifestyle, as a sign of co-responsibility, promoting the participation, the communion and the mission shared among priests, religious and lay people."

From its first day, the Church has been a community, with Jesus gathering around himself the apostles, the disciples, and the crowds. Sometimes he took the apostles aside to explain things in private, sometimes he sent the disciples out to prepare the towns he would be traveling to, and sometimes he would be moved by pity for the crowds and sped entire days healing their sick and being with them. While structure was needed then with the apostles having a special role, just as the Church needs structure now to maintain unity among roughly 1.4 billion Catholics, we have never been a corporation or a government or other modern ideas of institution revolving around authority and power.

We are a community, with a common mission and communion between all members. The Synodal lifestyle is not some new invention, it is just a new word for what we have always been, a word that emphasizes the need to hear each other as brothers and sisters.

In our small corner of this Church, the parish is not me and the parish is not you. The parish is us. My seemingly constant prayer is that visitors and new neighbors find in us a friendly place that connects them to Christ. In other words, that they find Christ and his apostles and his disciples and the crowds.

This month of November the papal intention will be "for anyone who has lost a child, that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter find support in their community and receive peace and consolation from the Holy Spirit."

Friends,

I would like to hear your initial opinion on a minor renovation of the sanctuary. Please go to <u>stmarkeleveland.com/voice</u> to participate in a parish survey.

When I came to St. Mark six years ago, many people quickly made the request that we get rid of the portrait of St. Mark on the back wall of the sanctuary and return the crucifix to the wall. The portrait had only been added within the few years before my arrival. I asked them all to give me five years before attempting so significant of a change to the church. I am grateful for their respectful acceptance of that answer, and as expected in the past year people have been proposing the question again.

Over the years I have had many people comment on how strange the portrait just as a general passing comment, and no one has mentioned that they especially like it. Personally, while I like the color that it brings into the sanctuary, I'm not impressed by its artistic style and it seems visually odd to have the crucifix in front of it. But to be fair I am always looking out from the sanctuary and rarely face it myself.

I have two conditions beyond simply removing the portrait and returning the crucifix to the wall: (1) we will also do a minor renovation of the sanctuary and consider other changes and (2) a portion of the total project cost will be a donation to the poor. I think one improvement could be new lighting, as right now it is so diffused that no element of the sanctuary can be highlighted. I also think the walls behind the statues of Mary and Joseph are very plain with oddly positioned lighting. I know some have suggested that we could do much more with the back wall, whose wood slats look into a storage room if you are at the right angle.

Before approaching Henninger's to get mock-ups of what they recommend, I want to hear from the parish if this is supported and desired beyond the individuals who have said something to me. Please take the time to participate in the survey. Even a response of "I don't care" is very important for me to know the mind of the parish.

If we decide to move ahead, I do not expect the work to take place until 2026. First we will need to get sample mock-ups of what options and ideas the professionals have and what the cost will be, get cost estimates, and make decisions. Then any change of this nature to our church does have to be approved by the Worship Office of the Diocese of Cleveland, as well as the usual approval process from the diocese for any expenditure over \$25,000, if the cost should be that great. And then we would need to schedule the work around Christmas and Easter and the other major events so that there is as little disruption as possible to the parish.

#### PARISH GRADE SCHOOL

As we move on into the memories of the 1980's, St. Mark had both a new pastor and new principal. Fr. Jame Wagner was named pastor and served St. Mark from 1978-1988. Sr. Judy Weirick served as principal from 1979-1996. In an interview about 15 years ago, Sr. Judy shared these memories:

- Gave detentions and as punishment- students had to carry books home for a week in a special bag.
- Had federal government TV's given to the school.
- The children at St. Mark wore uniforms, but their uniforms differed on what floor they were on. The top floor girls wore a red or green plaid skirt with a white shirt and vest, while the bottom floor wore red or green skirts with just a white polo shirt
- There was no carpeting in the school
- In 1988, an afterschool program was started, and our St. Mark Peace Pole was added.

The structure of the main school building was very different than it is today. There was no gym or separate kindergarten building, but there was a convent for the nuns. This changed in the 80's. A capital campaign led to the construction of the current Gymnasium, Faculty Room, and Community Center meeting room/Music classroom. In 1983, the convent became the Kindergarten building. (This building is presently known as the "IELC Building"- Innovation and Early Learning Center- and houses our PreK, two kindergarten classrooms, the STREAM Lab, and Library.) The sisters moved into house right next door since there were only a few sisters teaching at St. Mark.

The memory that mostly stands out to the past students that attended St. Mark in the 80's is walking home for lunch every day! (Times have certainly changed just in regards to student safety!)
Some other important memories from the 80's included:

- In 1983, the CYO 8<sup>th</sup> Grade football team won the City Championship. Their banner hangs in our school gym, and some of their team
  members have children in our school today. Some 41 years later, we added another CYO Championship banner last year after our
  CYO football team won the championship. History repeated itself!
- Fr. Anthony Muzic was appointed pastor of St. Mark in 1988

In other news, a special note of congratulations goes out to Scout Pack 268 who earned the Pope Paul VI National Catholic Unit Excellence Award. This award will be presented to them on Sunday at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. Congratulations to Scoutmaster Brad Schleter and our scouts. You have helped to make St. Mark continue to Shine Bright, and I am so very proud of you!

On Monday, October 21<sup>st</sup>, while the rest of the school was most probably sleeping in, ten of our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade girls met our STREAM teacher, Mrs. Henley, at the Great Lakes Science Center for the Stem Goes Red for Girls program. This program fills up fast, but we have been lucky enough to get into it almost every year. The purpose of this program is to introduce girls to the many different career opportunities available to them in the STEM related fields of science, technology, engineering, and math. Our girls started the day with hands-on activities and a career expo presented by different companies including Oatey, a family run, Cleveland based company that specializes in plumbing, Key Bank, University Hospitals, Lubrizol, Nasa, Cleveland Water, and many others were present. At each table students had the opportunity to learn about the company and job opportunities, and try an activity related to their product or service. Students attended a presentation on heart surgery, and learned about career paths in the field of medicine ranging from surgeon to surgical scrub technician. **Students had the opportunity to hold a human heart**. How brave they were!

The third breakout session included a hands-on engineering challenge and a presentation given by 3 engineers explaining different engineering paths such as mechanical, electrical, and civil as well as job descriptions and opportunities. Finally, students had a mentoring session and were able to speak one on one with professionals in STEM fields. One of our girls was later interviewed by Tiffany Tucker of Ch. 19 and her enthusiasm about this experience resonated great joy! It was yet another opportunity for St. Mark to *Shine Bright!*
