
# ST. MARK BEREAVEMENT

#### VIRTUS COMPLIANCY — IMPORTANT The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) will be doing on-site audits at parishes in the Diocese of Cleveland. It is imperative that prior to working with children coaches, scout leaders and helpers, St. Mark Staff, catechists & teachers (PSR and DAY school), parent volunteers, etc. - are Virtus compliant. This means that one must be: • Virtus trained (see below) • Current with reading on-line bulletins • Read and signed off on Policy for Protecting Children Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office) • Read and signed off on Standards of Conduct Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office) • New Volunteers must complete a Background Check through Virtus.org. In the Virtus website click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete. Current Volunteers with a BCI Fingerprint/ Background check must renew after 5 years through Virtus.org click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete. • Filled out a St. Mark Volunteer Application (turn into **Parish Office)** All of the above-mentioned requirements are mandatory. (You

All of the above-mentioned requirements are mandatory. (You can check your compliancy by going to "Virtus.org", signing in, and clicking on the green 'Training' tab.) If you are not sure of your compliancy, call Cheryl Birchfield at the Parish Office (216-226-7577) and your compliancy will be verified. If one is not Virtus compliant, YOU MAY NOT WORK/ VOLUNTEER WITH CHILDREN.

To see available Virtus training sessions please go to Virtusonline.org click on First Time Registrant, Begin Registration Process also available is List of Sessions, select the Cleveland Diocese. You MUST register to attend a session.

#### PRINCIPAL NEWS

It has been a great start to our new school year. This week, we welcomed sixteen PreK students into St. Mark as members of the Class of 2032! That seems really hard to believe! Their smiles were so infectious as they entered their classroom for the very first time, but parents and grandparent entered a little teary-eyed. Waiting for them was their teacher, Mrs. Amy Melvin-Marko and her aide, Mrs. Lynda Boriska. I cannot wait to share with you all the fun activities that will go on in their classroom this year.

I am sure many of you have items hanging on your refrigerator- although I am one who tries not to! Just this past week, I saw this quote hanging on the side of my sister's refrigerator, and I thought how powerfully true this is, so I wanted to share it with all of you.

"Smile often. Pray. Tell those that you love that you do. Rediscover old friends. Make new ones. Hope. Grow. Give. Give in. Buy some flowers. Share them. Keep a promise. Laugh often. Reach out. Hug a child. Slow down. See a sunrise. Listen to rain. Trust life. Have faith. Enjoy. Make some mistakes. Learn from them. Explore the unknown. Celebrate your own life. Give so much time to the improvement of yourself that you have no time to criticize others."

Many of these actions are quite attainable if we put our minds to it. For example, prayer is something we can do at any time in our day. I consider myself to be so lucky to be so close to church, although I do not need a church to pray. I often times drop into church before leaving for the day just to pray for a solution to a problem or just in thanksgiving for a great day. Taking time for personal prayer is transformational. Being a part of Mass, the greatest form of prayer, I find to be even more transformational for me.

I love the last part of the quote. Can you imagine how different this world would be if we spent more time improving ourselves and less time criticizing others? I found myself really thinking about that. How easy it is to find fault with others. Yet, we all make mistakes. And that is ok- as long as we learn from them.

Finally, I encourage you to celebrate your own life. All of us have special gifts and talents that should be shared with others; celebrate those gifts. As the school year enfolds, many of the gifts and talents of our students will emerge. This is just another additional "perk" of working in a school- watching children discover their special gifts and talents- and not just discovering these gifts, but exploring ways to put them to use for the benefit of others. I see our teachers sharing their gifts in their classrooms every day. One goal I have set for myself this year is to let them know how valuable every one of them is to the success of our school. Each one of them brings a special gift to St. Mark. I consider myself to be quite blessed to be part of such a caring group of professionals.
