





Principal News

As busy as our Kindergarten class was last week, our 8th Grade has been even busier. Last Sunday, the class donned their red "Class of 2024" t-shirts to play a very competitive basketball game against our CYO coaches. The event is what we call *Mark's Madness*, and it has been around for about fifteen years. All proceeds support our Parish Outreach program which assists families in both our parish and school when help is needed. It is a great community building event because it's larger than a basketball game- it provides an opportunity for people to join together for a great cause regardless of whether they have children in St. Mark School because Parish Outreach is bigger than our school. It is always a challenge to incorporate 46 students into a one-hour basketball game, making sure they all have fair playing time. What was particularly neat was when one of our 8th graders, who is in a wheelchair due to an injury, was wheeled out onto the court and after several attempts, was able to make a free throw! The entire student body rallied around him to cheer him on. That was amazing! Special thanks go out to Dianne Gorsek, Jean Berger, and Jack Koch for all the planning that went into this event. Another note of thanks to the Tome family for the shirt donation. Events like this bring back great memories. I remember sitting at the Sterba house with Mr. Adams trying to figure out how to get about 50 kids into this event we were calling Mark's Madness in support of Parish Outreach for the very first time. Here we are about 15 years later with this same event that is still as strongly supported as it was back then. It stands as a testimony to our families. May the legacy continue for at least another 15 years!

As I write this, our 8th Grade students are on their way to Washington D.C. Normally I go with them; it's a trip I love making with them. Knowing how Deacon Dave was, I chose to stay back to be with the rest of the student body. I will update you on their trip next week, but the itinerary I planned with the Nowak Tour Company was fabulous!

Our 7th Grade is to be commended on the service project they did for the poor. Students were asked to bring in some simple items found at home such as: 2 gallon sized zip-lock bags, 2 water bottles, 2 granola bars, 2 snack size bags of Goldfish, graham crackers, or vanilla wafer, etc., 2 cans with easy open lids of soup (non-condensed) or fruit cups, 2 plastic spoons, 2 napkins or travel size wipes, and 2 pairs of new adult male socks. Mrs. DeGennaro had the 7th Grade put "Blessing Bags" together and then invited some young men from St. Edward High School involved in helping the homeless through their Labre Ministry, speak to our students about their experiences and the joy they feel by helping others. Our students got a great deal out of the message these young men delivered. It is our responsibility as members of the Catholic Church and members of a global society to reach out to help in any way we can. To quote Saint Mother Teresa, "Do ordinary things with extraordinary love." Great job, 7th Grade.

Finally, our annual History Fair occurred this past week. Students from Grades 5 and 7 participated along with any student from Gr. 1-4 who was interested in the topic of Immigration. I was very impressed with the quality of work our students produced as well as the variety of topics. Some of the topics and fun facts are below:

Jackie Chan- He holds the Guinness record for most credits in the movie industry.

Arnold Schwarzenegger- He was the 38th governor of California.

Giannis Antetokounmpo – The struggle of his parents to provide for his family rivals the challenge of being immigrants.

Chinua Achebe- He was a Nigerian immigrant, an educator, and the author of the book, *Things Fall Apart*, known as the greatest work of literature to come out of Africa.

Yanek Gruener- As a young boy, he was taken to the first of 10 different concentration camps after the Nazi invasion of Poland.

Elon Musk- He founded a private space program called SpaceX.

Mario Andretti- Favorite quote: "If you have everything under control, you're not moving fast enough.

Hedy LaMarr- She was an actress and inventor during Hollywood's Golden Age.

Madeleine Albright- She was presented the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Barack Obama. She was the 64th United States Secretary of State.

Classes throughout the school viewed the projects while they were on display, and some even did a scavenger hunt looking for very specific facts. Some of these facts included:

- •What countries were the immigrants from?
- •Why did some immigrants leave their home country?
- •When and where did these immigrants arrive/ settle?
- •How did this immigration change lives or change the world for the better?

The entire school benefitted from these projects. Special thanks to our History Fair committee: Mrs. Baillis, Mrs. DeCore, Mrs. Gonzalez, and Miss Albrigo.
