#### VIRTUS COMPLIANCY — IMPORTANT The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) will be doing on-site audits at parishes in the Diocese of Cleveland. It is imperative that prior to working with children coaches, scout leaders and helpers, St. Mark Staff, catechists & teachers (PSR and DAY school), parent volunteers, etc. - are Virtus compliant. This means that one must be: • Virtus trained (see below) • Current with reading on-line bulletins • Read and signed off on Policy for Protecting Children Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office) • Read and signed off on Standards of Conduct Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office) • New Volunteers must complete a Background Check through Virtus.org. In the Virtus website click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete. Current Volunteers with a BCI Fingerprint/ Background check must renew after 5 years through Virtus.org click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete. • Filled out a St. Mark Volunteer Application (turn into **Parish Office)**

All of the above-mentioned requirements are mandatory. (You can check your compliancy by going to "Virtus.org", signing in, and clicking on the green 'Training' tab.) If you are not sure of your compliancy, call Cheryl Birchfield at the Parish Office (216-226-7577) and your compliancy will be verified. If one is not Virtus compliant, YOU MAY NOT WORK/ VOLUNTEER WITH CHILDREN.

To see available Virtus training sessions please go to Virtusonline.org click on First Time Registrant, Begin Registration Process also available is List of Sessions, select the Cleveland Diocese. You MUST register to attend a session.

## PRINCIPAL NEWS

The team we have on place here at school is a true blessing to everyone involved. I watched this week as our veteran teachers took time to assist our two new teachers, making sure their questions were answered and needs met. Teachers assisted one another in getting classrooms together, helped one another with setting up Activpanels in their classrooms, and were just present for general questions because as I told all of the teachers, there is never a silly question. The positivity and excitement continued to grow as the first day of school neared- and the first day did not disappoint! Not only were the teachers and parents happy- but so were the children! Hearing laughter, receiving happy hugs upon their arrivals, and just the overall excitement on the part of the children across all age groups was just so wonderful. I am most looking forward to what the school year brings because we are planning to resume all our "normal" activities- and adding a few more. It is very exciting!

A special congratulations goes out to one of our teachers, Mrs. Patricia McGinty, upon receiving a Special SPARK Teacher Recognition Award, presented to her in early August. I want to share with all of you the reasons I nominated her for this award: "Patricia McGinty, is an extraordinary educator who truly SPARKS not only her students but the entire St. Mark School community. As a classroom teacher, she articulates from the very first day of school clear student goals to both her students and their parents, provides ongoing progress monitoring on her children to assess in particular their reading growth and communicates data to parents and administration, provides instructional strategies aligned with that data collection, collaborates with colleagues in an effort to advance student knowledge to include a cross-curricular approach within varying disciplines, facilitates offsite and remote educational opportunities for her students, engages local community members and parents to share their work, engages in professional development opportunities to remain current in all aspects of education, serves on various school committees, instructs college students in the evening as an adjunct professor at CSU, and finds time to volunteer at both her parish and school functions to enhance our parish and school's mission and vision. Mrs. McGinty begins all that she does with prayer and truly leads by example as evidenced by being an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Mrs. McGinty finds great joy in teaching, especially preparing her students to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist Because she recognizes the importance of cross-curricular and multidisciplinary education, she is always seeking out opportunities for her students. Some examples of experiences include Young Astronaut Day, where the students were able to meet and spend time visiting Astronaut Douglas Wheelock on several occasions, NASA Mars Exploration Team which met after school, Cleveland Public Library where students were able to visit with Felton Thomas Jr., Director of the Cleveland Public Library. She has arranged, visits with meteorologists from Channels 3, 5, and 19, therapy dog visits in an effort to build reading fluency, in-person visits from authors and artist, and the Cleveland Metroparks Eco Explorers She was involved n planning our *Blue Roar Day* which received an award from Values in Action this year. Her high level of energy and passion together create a very positive classroom culture for learning. As a class, her students celebrate personal successes because year after year her students share a common belief- they LOVE LEARNING. It doesn't get any better than that! This is the most significant impact she makes in her children year after year. They are not afraid to take risks. It is an absolute pleasure to be in her classroom- at any given time they may be dancing, singing, writing, reading, constructing, and laughing together. Patty has taken the lead or been a committee member on various committees such as our Literacy Week, Math and Science Night, Career Day, Catholic Schools' Week activities, Grandparents' Day, school dances, May Crowning, and the Kindness Challenge and has served as a grade band lead teacher for Accreditation. These only name a few! Mrs. McGinty continues to seek out opportunities and PD that enhance her instruction and will seek out colleagues for advice or suggestions, tapping into their levels of expertise. Likewise, she makes herself available to those on staff who need her assistance. She is an asset to our faculty and highly regarded by teachers, parents, and students. Mrs. McGinty is a great example of a teacher who wears her heart on her sleeve and skips to school every day! Congratulations, Mrs. McGinty!

Our entire teaching staff recognizes that as a Catholic school, our first priority is to further develop the faith in each of our children, following in the footsteps of their parents. We begin and end every day in prayer, taking time to remember all those who are most in need of our prayers. Religion is taught every day- both as instruction and as a way of life, because as Fr. Adam reminded the faculty at our opening retreat, religion encompasses all that we are.
