


St. Mark Catholic Church



We will be collecting items for St. Edward High School Labre Ministry. The Labre ministry allows students, faculty & staff, alumni, and friends of St. Edward to directly serve the immediate needs of the poor every Thursday through the entire year. The ministry immersion, named after St. Benedict Joseph Labre, the patron saint of the homeless, allows students to see and experience the struggles of our homeless friends on the streets. This ministry is powerful as our students help prepare the meal, meet, and serve our poor brothers and sisters by coming to them.

Students hand-deliver food, clothing, hygiene kits, etc. to those we visit each week. This helps to instill in our students that every human being has dignity and that we should be preferential in charity to the poorest among us.

Any non-perishable items are appreciated especially canned soups.

Our Kindergarten has had a great deal to celebrate lately! They went on a fieldtrip to the theater to see a live production of *Little Red Riding Hood* and the *Three Little Pigs* performed by the Tennessee Players Theatre Company. They were so excited about going- and taking a school bus to get there! After they safely boarded the bus and departed St. Mark, I found myself thinking about all the small things we take for granted every single day! These children were SO excited about getting on a bus for the first time and equally excited about going to see a live play! Upon their return, one after the other told me all about what they saw and how great the ride on the bus was. I have to admit, their enthusiasm brought me such great joy and made me think that we should all be that excited about what we do in life.

There was also a great celebration for our primary students (and their teachers) as they celebrated being 100 days smarter. Our Kindergarten came dressed as if they were 100 years old, and the other classes dressed in 100 of "something". It was great to see the creativity of the students. I loved those dressed and actually "acting" the part of being 100 years old- aching backs, walking with the aid of walkers and canes, and lots of grey hair! This was all in great fun. The children were so proud of how much smarter they were after being in school for 100 days. Several of them told me how proud they were of knowing how to read- so well that our Kindergarten and 1st Grades took charge of three of the school Masses by doing the readings and intercessions. They definitely are 100 days smarter!

This time of year, all of our grade levels have time set aside from their academics to spend some time in a retreat. There are many benefits to spending time in a retreat. Some of these benefits include:

- •Provides time to think about accomplishments and growth and identify areas of weakness
- •Helps to rediscover skills and builds self-confidence
- •Allows one to take ownership of their actions
- •Assists one in learning accountability through responsibility
- •Instills moral virtues like perseverance and honesty
- •Allows connections to be made with peers

Our Kindergarten class wrapped themselves in a "pretzel-like form" and prayed this prayer: "I bow my head and twist my arms tight, before I climb in bed each night. I say a prayer to the Father above, to give him thanks and feel his love." Of course, pretzels were a big part of their retreat day! Our 1st Grade students talked about the different ways they could spread kindness and make a difference in someone's life then followed it up with an activity. A few of their ideas included:

- •Give hugs
- •Play with somebody who is alone
- •Help my family
- •Clean up

I am anxious to see how the other grade levels spend their time in retreat.

There is so much to celebrate at St. Mark School every single day. We are so richly blessed with little hearts who want to do so much!
