


St. Mark Parish

VIRTUS Program Compliancy

Check that you are up-to-date!

All staff and all volunteers who work with children (such as coaches, catechists, scout leaders, parent volunteers, etc.) are required to stay compliant with the VIRTUS program. No exceptions are made. This program is required by the Diocese of Cleveland, and we are audited annually.

For existing volunteers:

- · Stay current with the online bulletins
- Renew your BCI Fingerprint and Background check every five years through virtusonline.org (see the Toolbox tab for selection.com background check).

New and interested volunteers working with children:

- Attend a VIRTUS training. Registration is through virtusonline.org.
- •Read and sign the 2016 Policy for Protecting Children.
- •Read and sign the 2016 Standards of Conduct.
- Complete a background check through virtusonline.org (see the Toolbox tab for selection.com background check).
- •Complete the St. Mark Volunteer Application



PARISH GRADE SCHOOL

We are committed to forming students who grow in both knowledge and faith, developing the skills they need to succeed in today's world while remaining rooted in Gospel values. One of the ways we foster this growth is through our STREAM Lab, an exciting space where science, technology, religion, engineering, art, and math come together in creative and meaningful ways.

Using project-based learning and guided by our fantastic STREAM teacher, Mrs. Henley, students in all grade levels are able to explore concepts that connect to one or more STREAM disciplines. Some projects are designed to extend topics already introduced in the classroom, while others are stand-alone lessons created to spark curiosity and problem-solving.

The purpose of the STREAM Lab is not only academic. It is a space designed to encourage a growth mindset, teaching students that perseverance, effort, and reflection are keys to success. Projects also reinforce essential teamwork skills, teaching children the value of collaboration and shared problem-solving. By encountering challenges in a supportive environment, students learn to build resilience, to try again after mistakes, and to approach new tasks with curiosity and creativity.

Already this year, students have been busy exploring new ideas through hands-on projects. Third graders designed and tested ball runs using Keva planks as an introduction to the principles of force and motion. Second graders created Lego mazes for Hex Bugs, developing their understanding of design and engineering through playful experimentation. First graders read 21 Elephants and Still Standing, the story of the Brooklyn Bridge, and then built their own bridges sturdy enough to hold mini elephants, bringing history, engineering, and imagination together.

Through these experiences, our students are not only gaining academic knowledge but also learning to see the world with wonder, perseverance, and faith. In the STREAM Lab, they discover that curiosity is a gift, problem-solving is an opportunity, and collaboration is a pathway to building stronger communities. With Christ as our guide, the STREAM Lab invites our children to grow as learners, creators, and disciples, prepared to bring their unique gifts into the world.
