#### **PRINCIPAL NEWS**

As we ended last school year and began this year, our current 8th Grade families were already working on fundraising plans to offset the \$600 cost for their children in the 8th Grade to go to Washington D. C. in the spring. They have had several carwashes of which we are most appreciative of the support from the parish. They have sponsored a volleyball tournament here which is wrapping up this week, and they sponsored a shopping day at Only in Cleve. They are not finished yet! They have a few more events coming up. Just this past weekend they held a Fall Festival at Impett Park, which became a great community event.

We lucked out with the weather last Saturday. It was cool, but not rainy. When the sun came out, that even made it more perfect! There were many inflatable rides for the children (and some adults) to climb, slide down, or bounce around inside. There was an opportunity for pumpkin decorating, face painting, and refreshments. So many of the children wanted to show me how quickly they could climb and slide or how they could do a somersault in one of two bounce houses. One of the boys challenged me to the large slide, with his dad laughing in the background. (I know my limitations!) We had taken our granddaughter to the festival, and she had a ball!

I would have to say though, one of the best takeaways was what a community building event this was! So many people from the school community and surrounding neighborhood turned out and had some great conversations going on! Members of the class assisted with the blowups, the face painting, the pumpkin decorating, and the clean-up following.

One of the major benefits of community building activities is that individual members gain a sense of belonging. Community building can develop a sense of dignity, and restore one's sense of significance and relevance. Having a shared cause provides people with a sense of momentum and purpose. I think everyone would agree that we are all feeling the effects of the pandemic, quarantines and social isolation acutely. You may be missing "your people", your network and your community. Sure, we have stayed in touch with those with whom we are closest, but it is those more distant ties that are diminishing, disappearing or declining. Community is critical to our overall wellbeing and the decline of our connectedness is coming at the same time mental health issues are on the rise. In a study by Queen's University, 27% of people said they were suffering from loneliness, This event not only provided some funding for our 8th Grade Washington trip, but also provided an opportunity for people to just talk and laugh with one another.

So as our family returned home, with a butterfly painted on my granddaughter's face and a very glittery pumpkin in hand, I found myself thinking about the fact that it is these small moments in life that become forever memories in our hearts. Well done, 8th Grade students and parents! Have a great week! Mrs. Cocita
