


St. Mark Parish

St. Mark PSR Program 2025-2026 Registration

Our St. Mark PSR program is on Monday evenings from 6:30 – 7:30 in the school building. We serve students in Grades 1 – 8. Students in grades 2 and 8 are prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist (grade 2) and Confirmation (Grade 8), as part of our curriculum. For a student to receive these Sacraments they MUST be enrolled and attend PSR the previous year.

You can register in a number of different ways for the 2025-2026 school year:

Registration is due with payment by June 10, 2025.

- 1. Current PSR families will receive a packet with the registration materials. The packet will be sent home with your child.
- 2. The materials can be downloaded from the St. Mark Church website <u>www.stmarkcleveland.com</u>, under heading FAMILIES (at the top of the page) and by clicking the PSR tab.
- **3.** Registration materials can also be picked up at the Parish Office.

Registration forms and payment can be dropped off at the Parish Office or put in the Sunday collection, marked to the attention of PSR.

Classes will begin in September.

New and interested volunteers working with children:

- Attend a VIRTUS training. Registration is through virtusonline.org.
- •Read and sign the 2016 Policy for Protecting Children.
- •Read and sign the 2016 Standards of Conduct.
- Complete a background check through virtusonline.org (see the Toolbox tab for selection.com background check).
- •Complete the St. Mark Volunteer Application

Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week



PARISH GRADE SCHOOL

This is always a good time of year to reflect back on the many different service projects we have done since the beginning of this school year. Service projects are beneficial for children because they teach empathy, responsibility, and the value of helping others. By participating in activities like volunteering at shelters to feed the hungry, cleaning up parks, or collecting donations for those in need, children learn to appreciate different perspectives and understand the importance of community. These projects also build confidence and leadership skills, as children often take on meaningful roles and see the positive impact of their efforts. Most importantly, service projects help instill lifelong values such as kindness, teamwork, and civic engagement. Service is a very important component in our Catholic Identity goal, and in last week's bulletin, I wrote about an upcoming water project all our children will be involved in doing. Service is something we can all be a part of, and here are a few things we have accomplished this year:

- Halle Lawless, an instructor with the McKeon Group, has worked all year with our 8th Graders providing insight into the worlds of vari-1. ous groups of people who are struggling physically, mentally, and emotionally. She discussed how we can support them. Some of her topics included the struggles of the elderly, individuals with special needs, foster children, those who are homeless, and the sick and hospitalized. Our children made blankets, chemo bags filled with chapstick, journals, socks, lotion, and a blanket. They made special cards and created games and puzzles.
- 2 Gr 8 made no sew blankets for the Lake Erie Labrador Rescue.
- All grades K-8 made cards and wrote letters for active service men and women as well as Veterans. Special cards were made for the 3. organization Veterans' Last Patrol, which helps veterans in hospice.
- Thanksgiving canned food collection- students had to earn their donations by doing an act of service at home. Food was donated to 4. St. Edward Labre Ministry for the poor.
- Every class read books to earn "points" to purchase items needed in a new Habitat for Humanity build. Each grade was assigned a specific room to outfit with the money "earned" and together decided the needed items. Parent Club paid for the items. During Catholic Schools' Week, students and faculty brought in specific snack items to put into bags which were given to various 5.
- 6 groups including Cleveland Police and Fire, our councilmen and mayor, shelters, and the Office of Catholic Education. All bags had personalized notes to specific individual people.
- 7. The Kindergarten created bags of special snacks and toiletries during Lent and donated these to the St. Ignatius program to help the hungry. Their families donated the items which the students had to earn at home.
- The 7th Grade made Blessing Bags filled with toiletries for the homeless with special messages. St. Edward's Labre ministry came 8. out to explain this program to the students.
- q St. Joseph feast day canned food collection- students had to earn their donations by doing an act of service at home. Food was donated to St. Edward Labre Ministry for the poor. 10. As part of their retreat, the 7th Grade will be weeding and doing a spring clean-up of Impett Park.
- 11. The 7th Grade sponsored a used children's books collection for the "Thankful to Read" program.
- Students made cards for the cloistered nuns in the Cleveland area. 12
- The 2nd Grade collected cleaning items for Habitat for Humanity for their Jesus Day retreat. Habitat for Humanity came out to dis-13. cuss with all of St. Mark School the work that they do for the homeless in Cleveland.
- The 8th Grade assisted in setting up the parish Lenten Taize service and participated in various roles during the service. There were 14. 16 of our students who returned on a Friday evening and gave of their time for this spiritual experience for the parishioners of St. Mark and St. Mel.
- 15. Hoops for Hope provided an opportunity for our children to display their basketball skills in front of the entire school while raising money to donate toward the St. Baldrick Shave Your Mane event. It was great fun all for an even greater cause.
- 16. St. Mark School participated once again in the St. Baldrick's Shave Your Mane event. For the past 11 years, they have raised over \$600,000 for childhood cancer research.
- 17. The 8th Grade participated in a Mark's Madness basketball game attended by many school families and parishioners. The CYO parent coaches competed against the 8th Grade to raise funds for our \$t. Mark Parish Outreach program. The 7th Grade cleaned the bleachers and decorated for this event.
- 18. Our upcoming Walk for Water project is aimed at helping our children understand the difficulty developing countries have after reading A Long to Water and Beatrice's Goat. Each student will secure pledges for the water walk. All money will be donated to Dr. Dave Clifford's project in bringing clean water to the people of the Honduras.

I am so proud of our children and the empathy they have shown for others. They have certainly allowed their light to SHINE BRIGHT this vear!
