Friends,

A few years ago I added the monthly papal intention to the bulletin, adjacent to the liturgy schedule, and if you come to daily mass you know that I typically include it in the universal prayers. The papal intentions are set for the entire year, months before the year actually begins. Praying with them is a personal devotion in my life that I've been happy to share with you, and for some time I have thought it would be nice to give a reflection at the end of each month.

January's intention was for the gift of diversity in the Church, that the Holy Spirit may help us to recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community and to discover the richness of different traditions and rituals in the Catholic Church. Usually when we hear the word "diversity" in America we think of racial diversity, but this is more broadly about the different charisms (gifts/talents and the different traditions and rituals in our Church. Let's not forget that our Church spans the entire world, with brothers and sisters on every continent, speaking every language, and with beautiful cultures!


Over the month I have thought about the different charisms we have locally. First off in the diocese I think of the priests that I studied with and the lay people I have worked with in the parishes that are capable in so many ways that I am not. I hope I have learned something from them all, and I hope as a parish community that we see the blessings and strengths that come from each person around us.

I'm also grateful for the different traditions and rituals. Sometimes Roman Catholics forget or do not know that there are 24 Eastern Catholic churches within our Catholic Church (although you've heard of Byzantine Catholics, Maronite Catholics, etc.). I always enjoy learning the different things they do. Imagine during Easter time if we greeted each other not with "Hello" but with "Christ is risen!" and replying "Indeed, he is truly risen!"... or during a wedding mass crowning the bride and groom... or when a priest is invited to your home the first thing he says when he comes through the door is "Peace be with this house". And imagine our customs that are so regular to us that we take them for granted, but perhaps to an Eastern Catholic would be something very new and interesting.

Next month in February we will pray for the terminally ill. Consider joining in this intention from Pope Francis. You can hear more including a video from Pope Francis at popesprayerusa.net



FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community," the theme of this year's Catholic Schools' Week, are core values by which all of us are challenged to live. We are gifted with a faith in God, who loves each one of us individually. We should always strive for excellence, recognizing that it is sometimes in those moments of failure that we learn the most, and we are challenged to live a life of service as members of a greater community. So as we celebrate Catholic Schools' Week 2024, it is important that as a Catholic school community, we demonstrate these values as we celebrate who we are!

As I tour interested families around our school, I always make my first stop in Church. Christ is the single most important reason why we are St. Mark School, so it is a very fitting stop. I tell parents that we are always doing something faith-filled- whether it is Mass, Eucharistic Adoration which has drawn families to pray together during the day, Stations of the Cross, the Living Rosary, or a grade level retreat. Our faith is what binds us to one another and allows us to carry one another in times of need. Time and time again throughout our school year, our school community joins together in joyful service to others on need.

Faith is powerfully transforming because if we live faith-filled lives, then we are living lives of service. Service is a very important component of discipleship. It allows us the opportunity to bring Christ to others in sometimes the gentlest of ways. I see examples of our children living lives of service every single day. During Catholic Schools' Week, every family has been asked to donate a specific food item that will become part of larger gift bags and baskets which will be shared with others. Personal notes written by the students will accompany each bag or basket. This collaborative undertaking will make our students feel so good about themselves and what they were able to accomplish together. Every day I see examples of student service throughout our building. They LOVE holding doors for one another- especially at dismissal. I see great examples of kindness like inviting others to sit with them at lunch or play with them at recess, helping their teachers in their classrooms, or helping me when something needs delivered or carried elsewhere. (I am sure they like getting out of class, but they like being needed and helpful even more. That is what families do!)

Every year, I meet with the 8th Grade to have them create essays about what St. Mark means to them. This year, over and over again, the message came through of how leadership opportunities, service opportunities, and classroom expectations have formed them into confident young adults. Several of our students are sharing their essays this weekend at the Masses both here at St. Mark and at St. Mel. Here are a few ideas taken from their essays:

- Agnes: "I am changed because of my Catholic education. It is not easy to make a grade school so bright, so powerful that I will be telling stories to my grandchildren someday."
- Joseph: "Earlier this year, our 8th Grade class went to Borromeo Seminary. It was an amazing hands-on experience, which gave me a glimpse onto what it is like to become a priest."
- Fia: "The learning environment that we have been given here is so important when it comes to Christ being in our everyday lives."
- Cami: "One of the most special teachers here to me is Mrs. Riordan, my mom. Not many people get to have their mom as their teacher, and I am so blessed that St. Mark gave me that opportunity."
- Lauren: "This past year I have done many hands-on activities. I have held a real heart, learned about scientists, engineers, and nurses, and I got to watch a live-streamed surgery."
- Gregory: "St. Mark has brought me closer to God. If I ever have a hard time in life, the first thing I do is pray to God, because I know there is a solution waiting."
- Olivia: "Each day at school I am given the chance to strengthen my relationship with God. That is something very special. Going to school here has shown me how much more beautiful life can be when your faith is a priority."

Since children are creators, builders, natural collaborators, and our engineers of tomorrow, it is important that we provide them with as many scientific and technological opportunities that we can. I am proud to say that our school is outfitted with some exceptional technology. One of the items on display in the Stream Lab are the 3D chess pieces students created for our Chess Club to use. It is not uncommon on my visits to the Stream lab to dodge robots that the students have programmed to perform pre-determined feats. Both creativity and laughter are evident- and that is what education is all about!

Hanging in the hallways throughout the school are family reflections on why St. Mark School is special. Families commented on how our teachers truly care about every single student. I see that every day. Other comments included things like: the undeniable sense of community, school pride, the fun-loving atmosphere, children are appreciated for their unique differences, and the opportunities to get involved, to name a few.

Our children are creatively involved in science and history fair projects. Their Science Fair projects are on display in the Social Hall today during our Open House. You are welcomed to view them. Also in the Social Hall is our Scholastic Book Fair. While touring the school, make sure you stop down by the Gym and enjoy a small ice cream treat on us! Ice cream is great at any time during the day!

Thanks to the support from our Parent Club, we are able to bring the Great Lakes Shakespeare Theater's education department to St. Mark's for students in Gr. 6-8. Each grade previously studies one of Shakespeare's plays (*Macbeth, Julius Caesar, Romeo and Juliet*), and then sees live performances directly in front of them in their classrooms, role played, and discussed in depth. Our children have been to Playhouse Square seeing live theater at its best, the Face to Face Holocaust program, Stem Goes Red for Girls at the Great Lakes Science Center, and Native American Star Stories, with many more trip planned for the spring.

Catholic Education provides academic excellence in a faith-filled environment. Our children are expected to not only grow academically but to make contributions to our Church, our community, and our world. We are blessed to have a faculty who dedicates themselves to the successful growth of each individual child. They are a faith-filled group of professional men and women who work countless hours beyond the school day. We are blessed to have Fr. Adam, who supports our school and all my endeavors. I am personally blessed to have an assistant principal, Mrs. Christine Gunn, who goes above and beyond all expectations in helping me execute so many of my ideas! (I am pretty sure I drive her nuts at times!) And finally, we are also blessed to have support from you, our parish community. Your support allows us the opportunity to be a school "United in Faith and Community". May God bless you and thank you for your unwavering support. Enjoy Catholic Schools' Week 2024!
