Friends,

The papal intention this past month was "for the pastoral care of the sick, that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick confer to those who receive it and their loved ones the power of the Lord and become ever more a visible sign of compassion and hope for all."

As a priest, each sacrament is incredible to celebrate and a unique experience of the heart of Christ for *this* person, in *this* moment. Some anointings I cry myself along with the family that I have never met, gathered around a dying loved one, as I tell them that our home is not this world but in heaven. Other anointing as I lay my hands on a young person I pray that some miracle will happen even if I never know. But most anointings... by far most anointings... there is a strong and realistic hope of recovery, and I am helping someone to look past suffering and uncertainty to something beyond all that.

The prayer that those anointed and their families become "a visible sign of compassion and hope" to me is understanding that this sacrament does not prepare us for death, it prepares us for life... whether that is life in this world or the greater life to come. I hope when you or a loved one is seriously sick and at the first moment of diagnosis, you'll let Christ be there through me or some other priest.

This month of August the papal intention will be, "for political leaders, that they be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and for the common good, especially caring for the poor and those who have lost their jobs."

VIRTUS COMPLIANCY — IMPORTANT

The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) will be doing on-site audits at parishes in the Diocese of Cleveland. It is imperative that prior to working with children - coaches, scout leaders and helpers, St. Mark Staff, catechists & teachers (PSR and DAY school), parent volunteers, etc. - are Virtus compliant. This means that one must be:

- · Virtus trained (see below)
- Current with reading on-line bulletins
- · Read and signed off on Policy for Protecting Children Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office)
- · Read and signed off on Standards of Conduct Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office)
- · New Volunteers must complete a Background Check through Virtus.org. In the Virtus website click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete.

Current Volunteers with a BCI Fingerprint/Background check must renew after 5 years through Virtus.org click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete.

· Filled out a St. Mark Volunteer Application (turn into Parish Office)

All of the above-mentioned requirements are mandatory. This information can also be found on the church website at stmarkcleveland.com. Click the Families tab and click the Virtus tab. (You can check your compliancy by going to "Virtus.org", signing in, and clicking on the green 'Training' tab.) If you are not sure of your compliancy, call Cheryl Birchfield at the Parish Office (216-226-7577) and your compliancy will be verified. If one is not Virtus compliant, YOU MAY NOT WORK/VOLUNTEER WITH CHILDREN.

To see available Virtus training sessions please go to Virtusonline.org click on First Time Registrant, Begin Registration Process also available is List of Sessions, select the Cleveland Diocese. You MUST register ONLINE to attend a session.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: "I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for." These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for.
