


St. Mark Catholic Church



Veterans Observance



PRINCIPAL NEWS

The purpose of a Student Council is to give students an opportunity to develop leadership by organizing and carrying out school activities and service projects. In addition to planning events that contribute to school spirit and community welfare, the Student Council is the voice of the student body. Over the years, our Student Council has planned many fun activities for the entire school, made suggestions on topics like the dress code and recess that I took into serious consideration, and researched problems and solutions regarding current issues like the implementation of a water conservation and a recycling program right here on our campus. This current school year, twenty-five of our Junior High students are serving on our Student Council. I am very excited to hear what they have to say! Our STREAM Lab has been up and running and the children are thoroughly enjoying what they are doing! We just received two more 3D printers so more children can both create and print at the same time. Students in Gr. 3-8 have been using snap circuits to study electrical circuits. I observed one group using snap circuits to understand concepts of how electricity works. Snap Circuits use electronic blocks that snap onto a board so electricity can flow from a battery through the switch. Before this occurs, the children needed to learn about positive and negative parts to a battery and what happens if the battery is not inserted correctly. Other projects involved building light dimming capabilities along with the knowledge of how/why this occurs and creating the ability to fly apparatus. What impressed me the most was the enthusiasm and engagement of our children. Students in Gr. K-2 have been using Keva planks to learn about base, balance, supports, and angles. They discussed engineering and building foundations for buildings and houses. The 4th Grade got their hands dirty making plaster fossils. I am looking forward to some really great things occurring this year.

Finally, October 4th was the Feast of St. Francis. Francis was born in Assisi, Italy, in 1182 and grew up living a privileged life as the son of a wealthy cloth merchant. Saint Francis of Assisi became a Catholic friar who gave up a life of wealth to live a life of poverty. He gave all his money to the poor. Francis established the Franciscan Order and in 1212 organized a women's order called the Poor Clares. It was run by Saint Clare of Assisi.. Francis is a very well-known saint who is often depicted being flocked by birds, petting a deer, or shaking hands with a wolf. An interesting fact is that he had a stigmata (the wounds of Christ on his hands, feet, and side). Fr. Adam made a special visit to our 2nd Grade to talk about St. Francis on his feast day. Fr. Adam spoke to the children about the life of Francis and the humble life Francis lived. It was a great reminder that all of us should be living lives of humility. The children loved Fr. Adam's visit and the lessons he shared on the life of St. Francis. Each of the children was able to bring in a favorite stuffed animal in honor of St. Francis.
