# St. Mark PSR Program 2025-2026

Registration

Our St. Mark PSR program is on Monday evenings from 6:30 - 7:30 in the school building. We serve students in Grades 1 – 8. Students in grades 2 and 8 are prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist (grade 2) and Confirmation (Grade 8), as part of our curriculum. For a student to receive these Sacraments they MUST be enrolled and attend PSR the previous year.

You can register in a number of different ways for the 2025-2026 school year:

#### Registration is due with payment by June 10, 2025.

- 1. Current PSR families will receive a packet with the registration materials. The packet will be sent home with your child.
- 2. The materials can be downloaded from the St. Mark Church website www.stmarkcleveland.com, under heading FAMILIES (at the top of the page) and by clicking the PSR tab.
- Registration materials can also be picked up at the Parish Office.

Registration forms and payment can be dropped off at the Parish Office or put in the Sunday collection, marked to the attention of PSR.

Classes will begin in September.



## PARISH GRADE SCHOOL

Two weeks ago, we held several religious events during the week. On Monday, students in Grades 3-8 gathered with members of St. Mark and St. Mel parishes to pray for Pope Francis. The teachers had discussed his passing in their classrooms as well as the procedures and rituals followed when a pope dies and when the Conclave begins. As of this writing, the Conclave has not convened; however, our prayers as a school for the cardinals soon to be tasked with electing a successor are being offered daily. Once the Conclave begins on May 7<sup>th</sup>, history will change. The Mass was beautiful, honoring a man who chose to live his life as a humble and kind leader. He spoke and wrote about peace, compassion, and the importance of caring for the poor. He talked often about mercy and forgiveness, which are so very important in today's world. He set an example to us all by living simply and serving others. I think one of his most admirable traits was how he brought people together, no matter their backgrounds. In one of his more recent encyclicals, Fratelli tutti (2020), he wrote about many of these points. He was a good and faithful servant.

On Tuesday, Bishop Malesic celebrated Mass with our school in honor of our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. During his homily, he reflected back on some of our rich history, remembering the people who have worked at St. Mark over these past 75 years. The sacrifices they made along with the traditions they began many years ago have contributed to St. Mark School being a vibrant school community. Following Mass, Bishop Malesic walked our hallways and commented on how respectful our children are. As we were touring the ILEC (Innovation and Early Learning Center (formerly known as the Kindergarten Building), he was treated to a demonstration by some of our 7<sup>th</sup> Grade students of how Sphero Bots, which enable our children to use coding, operate. Some of the students had programmed a message into their "robots" welcoming Bishop Malesic. As we continued on our tour, we stopped in the PreK classroom where a delightful song was sung by our PreK children about their moms. (They have a very special Spa Day coming up where they will pamper their moms with facials, massages, nail polish, and cucumbers for moms' eyes.) Bishop Malesic sat with the children in every classroom he was able to visit and just talked to them. I loved this, as did the children, because they are the future of our church.

The week was not over however! On Wednesday, forty of our 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students received the Sacrament of Confirmation, their final Sacrament of Initiation. They have prepared for this sacrament all year. Bishop Woost administered this sacrament to them at Our Lady of the Angels because we are now doing Confirmations regionally. It was a beautiful Mass, and our confirmandi were so excited. Miss McLaughlin is their religion teacher and did a great job preparing these young adults for the sacrament. Fr. Adam made regular stops in their classroom for instruction as well. Thank you, Miss Albrigo, Mrs. McCarthy Silver, Mrs. Puckett, Mr. Klein, and Mrs. Gunn for your behind-the-scene help as well.

Finally, on Friday, every classroom spent time in prayer at Eucharistic Adoration throughout the school day. Many of our children were joined by members of their families, which is such a beautiful sight. Eucharistic Adoration offers our children the opportunity to deepen their relationships with God by spending quiet, personal time in His presence. In a world filled with noise, distractions, and busy life styles, Adoration offers a sacred space for peace, reflection, and spiritual renewal. Thank you, Fr. Adam and Russ Bauer, for providing us with this opportunity.
