Greetings from The Church-Budget Envelope and Mailing Company.

Some of you may be aware of delays in the offering envelope mailings over the past couple months. Due to supply chain and the inability to add employees at the rate necessary has created a slow draw on production and shipping. Recently, both of those issues have been resolved. However the "cathup" would jeopardize long term delivery.

In order to get back to expected levels of timely deliveries, we are forced to suspend the production of the remaining supply of your February envelopes. The offering envelopes will resume and be delivered by the first Sunday in March. Quarterly supply will restart in April.

Never in our company's history have we had to skip scheduled mailings and we are doing all we can to make sure this never happens again. We deeply apologize for this necessary course of action and the inconveniences this has caused you and your church family.

PRINCIPAL NEWS

We certainly had great daily celebrations throughout this past week as we celebrated Catholic Schools' Week 2023! We began the week with our Open House last Sunday. So many people made visits to our STREAM Lab as well as the rest of our Innovation and Early Learning Center. While there, some of our students were present to demonstrate how to program small robots using their coding skills; these robots were running all over the place! Other students were demonstrating how our 3D printers operate and showcased the chess pieces they personally created for their chess club. Others were demonstrating what occurs every day in our news studio, WSMS. Here they showcased the teleprompter they program and read from when broadcasting live, the control room where all the behind-the-scenes work occurs during each broadcast, and the green screen which at any point in time may have us in Rome, on a gondola boat, or some other exotic place. Our morning broadcasts are all completely run by the students themselves, who create the scripts, the backgrounds, and the graphics. Special thanks go out to Mrs. Greuloch, the moderator of WSMS and Mrs. Henley, her backup who assist the students in making magic happen every morning on WSMS.

Many people took advantage of their time and visited our PreK and Kindergarten classrooms as well as the art room, all of which are located in this same building. Meanwhile, over in the main school building, many people visited classrooms to see what happens every single day. Some stopped by to say hello to their former teachers, many visited the book fair and science fair, and others just wanted to see what makes us so proud! Finally, the line grew at the ice cream stand which was located by the gym. Ice cream is great any time of day! It was an excellent way to kick off the start of Catholic Schools' Week.

The science fair projects were both innovative and quite creative! Here are a few of the many projects that were on display:

- Pat's Phone Stand-propped phone stand and credit card holder
- Gone No More Golf Balls- alarmable golf ball
- Shoe Lace Saver-focuses on keeping shoes tied
- Crispy cooler- cools you down while cooling your drinks
- MELT-tronic Shovel-a heated shovel to make shoveling less stressful
- The Dog Feeder- automatically feeds your pet
- The Measure Marker- allows you to remember when measuring ingredients when cooking
- Key-Print- mini computer operated from your fingerprint to perform household tasks
- Walking Rainbow- demonstration of how quickly water travels
- Rock Candy- demonstration of seed crystal lollipop sticks

There were 50 projects on display from students in grades 1-4. Many thanks to Mrs. Kehl for organizing this part of the fair. Meanwhile, Mr. Fial had his 6th and 8th Grade students working hard on their innovations and presentations that were judged by nine adults who came in to listen and judge the students' presentations. Many thanks to Mr. Fial and our volunteer judges.

On Monday, we celebrated our parish and community. Students wrote letters of appreciation to our rectory staff, our shut-ins, and our Veterans which were delivered to them later in the week. St. Ed's Trash Talkers performed for us, and certainly had the gym rocking!

On Tuesday, we celebrated our students by beginning the day with Mass, and later every class was treated to a movie and snacks, which were provided by our Parent Club.

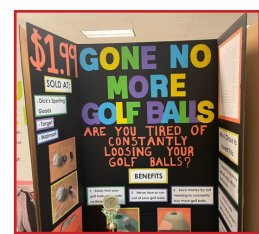
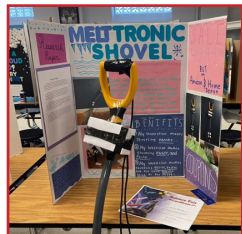
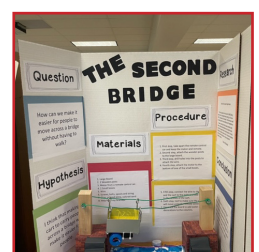
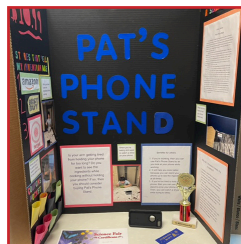
