Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fasting and abstinence. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. On days of fasting, the faithful eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal, with no eating between meals. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. On days of abstinence, the faithful do not eat meat. Abstinence is obligatory from age 14 onwards.







I wanted to share with you a few more of our Catholic Schools' Week activities.

At all of the weekend masses both at St. Mark and St. Mel, one of our 8th Grade students each shared a written reflection piece on what their education has meant to them, now that they are preparing to move on into high school. Congratulations to Fia D., Agnes B., Joseph A., Jack C., Olivia K., and Cami R., all of whom wrote and delivered beautiful essays. Their poise and reflections were certainly heartfelt by so many who made a point of sharing compliments with me following these masses.

Several of our Student Council members attended the Catholic Schools' Week Mass at the Cathodral of St. John the Evangelist along with their moderators. Bishop Malesic, the 12th Bishop of Cleveland, celebrated this Mass. Several of our students were asked in advance to take the gifts up during the Mass, which was an honor to do. Following Mass, our student representatives had a photo taken

with the bishop.

As part of Catholic Schools' Week, we have a day of service that involves our entire school community. Every family and faculty member was asked to donate a particular snack item for gift bags for our First Responders. Every student created a card thanking our First Responders and other service members of our community for the work that they do for all of us. Our 7th Grade students assembled the gift bags with the snack donations and cards the children made. Throughout the day on Wednesday and Thursday of Catholic Schools' Week, members of all five Cleveland Police Districts, our West Park Cleveland Fire Department and EMS, and our Canine Unit, stopped by the school to pick up their gift bag donations. Mrs. Gunn and I dropped off gift bags to our Mounted Police Unit and Diocesan offices. Some of our students were able to visit the 2nd District Police Department in person after school to see first-hand the overwhelming appreciation these men and women had for this simple act of service. In all, 267 gift bags were filled and delivered, along with boxed filled with additional snacks. This simple act of service reminds me of the words Martin Luther King said during his ministry of service, "Life's most persistent and urgent question is: What are you doing for others?" Our families came through loud and clear! Another activity we were able to enjoy was a visit by St. Ignatius High School's Circus. Several of their students came out along with one of our graduates, Mr. Chris Laco who is their moderator, and performed juggling acts in front of our packed audience. Our children sat with amazement on their faces, and several told me throughout the day that they want to do that someday!

We also were able to enjoy the talents of so many of our students at our annual Talent Show. We enjoyed some dancing, singing, gymnastics, cheerleading, and a host of other talents. The applause and encouragement from the audience was most evident. Students cheered students on. A special thanks goes out to Miss Dunleavy, Mrs. Schimming, Dr. Rentz, Mrs. Diamond, and Miss Colegrove, who moderated this event.

Finally, we have some amazing spellers in our school! We held our annual Spelling Bees for Grades K-4 followed by Grades 5-8, and what I noticed most was how the children who were competing were encouraging one another. That was great to see. One of our Assistant Superintendents, Mr. Joe Waler, stopped by to see this event and tour the school. He had never been to St. Mark before. He commented several times about how happy our children are and what a great and respectful community we have. I could not agree more! He participated in the 1st Floor Spelling Bee by giving students some of the words to spell. Several of the children told him he had a voice like they hear in movies! Thanks to our Spelling Bee committee members: Mrs. DeCore, Miss Colegrove, Miss Dunleavy, Mr. Troyan, Ms. DeGennaro, and Mrs. Gorsek.
