2022 Lenten Information

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord

Friday, March 25th, is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. Solemnities are not observed as penitential days. Therefore, by virtue of the law (can. 1251) and the liturgical nature of the day, penitential practices, like fasting or abstaining from eating meat, are not required on this day, even though it falls on a Friday in Lent.

PRINCIPAL NEWS

Last week we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Malesic. The candidates had been preparing all year to receive this sacrament. In. addition, they each completed acts of service within their parish and surrounding community. The pandemic inhibited them from doing some acts of service, but they discovered ways to achieve the requirement by thinking creatively. Congratulations to all our Confirmandi. A special note of thanks to Fr. Adam, Mr. Garvin, Deacon Dave, Mrs. David, Miss McLaughlin, Mrs. Gallagher, Mrs. Prokop, Mrs. Puckett, and Mr. Klein for the roles each of them played in assisting these candidates throughout this time of preparation.

The following morning, forty-four of our 8th Graders climbed a bus at 6:30 A.M. that took them to Washington D.C. for three days. Miss McLaughlin,

Mr. Adams, and I accompanied them along with several of their parents. We packed in many miles on foot, but our students really were able to experi-

ence so much. Here are a few of the places they visited:

Arlington National Cemetery, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Iwo Jima Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, Vietnam Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Korean Memorial, Ford's Theatre, Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial, the Smithsonian Natural History Museum and the American History Museum, the Martin Luther King Memorial, the White House Visitors Center, the Police Memorial where a wreath was left behind in honor of Officer Wayne Leon and Officer Shane Bartek, and the Air Force Memorial. We attended Mass at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, followed by a tour, and after departure, we stopped in Shanksville, PA to experience the Flight 93 Memorial. You would have been very proud of the every one of these students. The respect they had certainly reflected the pride they felt for this great country as well as the gratitude they had for those who lost their lives in service to our coun-

During this time of year, all of our grade levels spend some time in a prayerful retreat. The pictures below say more than I could say in words. Our children were given time to feel the presence of Christ in their lives.

Finally, while we were in Washington, the rest of the school experienced a very motivational speaker, Scott Boyle, from the University of Notre Dame. Mr. Boyle spoke to our students in Gr. K-2 about the Gift of the Holy Spirit in their lives, and the students in Gr. 3-7 listened to him elaborate on our school theme of "Be Kind." He told the students that being kind means putting others before ourselves. He explained we should not expect a reward for our acts of kindness, although so often we find reward and satisfaction through the emotional response of the recipient of our kindness. He spoke about the paths we have based on our own unique personalities, interests, abilities, and talents. It is through the little moments and choices we make in our lives that we follow the path God intends for us. He reminded the students that we will never be good at EVERYTHING, and that is okay. God made us the way we are, and we are loved. Following the presentation, I asked Mrs. True to gather the students' thoughts on what they heard:

Norah: I liked when he told stories with energy

Liz: I liked when Mr. Scott talked about doing what makes YOU happy

Braylen: I thought it was cool how all of his friends played football and sports, but he didn't.

Emmet: Kindness has an impact.

Evelyn: I liked how he talked about not being good at sports because I'm not great at sports as well.

Gigi: God tells us to recognize who we are. Olivia: He said we are all called to serve God.

We had a good and full week.
