



# **Protecting God's Children**

The Diocese of Cleveland's "Protecting God's Children" program is a continuing effort to instruct and inform everyone about the protection of children from sexual abuse. ## VIRTUS COMPLIANCY — IMPORTANT

The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) will be doing on-site audits at parishes in the Diocese of Cleveland. It is imperative that prior to working with children - coaches, scout leaders and helpers, St. Mark Staff, catechists & teachers (PSR and DAY school), parent volunteers, etc. - are Virtus compliant. This means that one must be:

- Virtus trained (see below)
- · Current with reading on-line bulletins
- Read and signed off on Policy for Protecting Children Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office)
- Read and signed off on Standards of Conduct Revised 2016 (turn into Parish Office)
- New Volunteers must complete a Background Check through Virtus.org. In the Virtus website click on the "Toolbox" tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the process. Must have a credit card to complete.
- Current Volunteers with a current BCI
  Fingerprint/Background check must renew after
  5 years through Virtus.org click on the "Toolbox"
  tab, click on the Selection.com tab and begin the
  process. Must have a credit card to complete.
- Filled out a St. Mark Volunteer Application (turn into Parish Office)

All of the above-mentioned requirements are mandatory. (You can check your compliancy by going to "Virtus.org", signing in, and clicking on the green Training' tab.) If you are not sure of your compliancy, call Cheryl Birchfield at the Parish Office (216-226-7577) and your compliancy will be verified. If one is not Virtus compliant, **YOU MAY NOT WORK/VOLUNTEER WITH CHILDREN.**

#### **PRINCIPAL NEWS**

Catholic Schools: Faith, Excellence, and Service," the theme of this year's Catholic Schools' Week, are core values by which all of us are challenged to live. We are gifted with a faith in God, who loves each one of us individually. We should always strive for excellence, recognizing that it is sometimes in those moments of failure that we learn the most, and we are challenged to live a life of service. So as we celebrate Catholic Schools' Week 2023, it is important that as a Catholic school community, we demonstrate these values as we celebrate who we are!

As I tour interested families around our school, I always make my first stop in Church. Christ is the single most important reason why we are St. Mark School, so it is a very fitting stop. I tell parents that we are always doing something faith-filled- whether it is Mass, Eucharistic Adoration which has drawn families to pray together during the day this year, Stations of the Cross, the Living Rosary, or a grade level retreat. Our faith is what binds us to one another and allows us to carry one another in times of need. This was powerfully displayed when our children truly helped one another get through the days following the passing of Mr. Adams, our P.E. teacher. These amazing children comforted one another, cried together, and just sat and listened. They carried one another during that time of need. There were times when they did not need to use words; their actions said it all.

Faith is powerfully transforming because if we live faith-filled lives, then we are living lives of service. Service is a very important component of discipleship. It allows us the opportunity to bring Christ to others in sometimes the gentlest of ways. I see examples of our children living lives of service every single day. During Catholic Schools' Week, every family has been asked to donate a specific food item that will become part of larger gift baskets which will be given to our First Responders, our Veterans, the people working at the Office of Catechetical Formation and Education, and our parish shut-ins. Personal notes written by the students will accompany each basket. This collaborative undertaking will make our students feel so good about themselves and what they were able to accomplish together. Every day I see examples of student service throughout our building. They LOVE holding doors for one another, inviting others to sit with them at lunch or play with them at recess, and help their teachers in their classrooms. These are examples of the unprompted and kind service that I see every day.

Every year, I meet with the 8th Grade to have them create essays about what St. Mark means to them. This year, over and over again, the message came through of how leadership opportunities, service opportunities, and classroom expectations have formed them into confident young adults. Three of their essays are being shared at the Masses this weekend. Here are a few ideas taken from their essays:

- Teagan: "Having the opportunity to do 3D printing and coding in the Stream Lab is life changing."
- Logan: "I am able to receive a Catholic education where I can learn about my faith and be surrounded by people who are kind and compassionate."
- · Raegan: "The teachers are dedicated in providing healthy, stimulating learning conditions as well as always encouraging critical thinking skills."
- Casey: "We have a great parish and community that supports us in many ways."
- Faith: "Receiving an education here really is a blessing because the teachers want to see you succeed and are willing to go the extra mile to help. They have a place for everyone here."

Since children are creators, builders, natural collaborators, and our engineers of tomorrow, it is important that we provide them with as many scientific and technological opportunities that we can. I am proud to say that our school is outfitted with some exceptional technology. One of the items on display in the Stream Lab are the 3D chess pieces students created for our Chess Club to use. It is not uncommon on my visits to the Stream lab to dodge robots that the students have programmed to perform pre-determined feats. Both creativity and laughter are evident- and that is what education is all about!

Hanging in the hallways throughout the school are student reflections on "30 Things I Am Thankful For..." This idea was given to me by parishioner Mary Jane Miller. Here are a few things on their lists taken from all grade levels: "God, Spanish, snow days, my mom and dad, books, my Nana and Papa, snacks, music, food, pets, doctors, firemen and police, the ability to hope, ability to pray when I want, therapy dogs, Veterans, ability to read, life from God, animals and plants, multiplication, sports, and Mass."

Our WSMS crew has put together a presentation for you to view about St. Mark School which will be playing on the Activpanels all our classrooms. Take a few minutes to watch this presentation if you are able.

Our children are creatively involved in science and history fair projects. Their Science Fair projects are on display in the Social Hall today during our Open House. You are welcomed to view them. Also in the Social Hall is our Scholastic Book Fair. While touring the school, make sure you stop down by the Gym and enjoy a small ice cream treat on us! Ice cream is great at any time during the day!

Thanks to the support from our Parent Club, we are able to bring the Great Lakes Shakespeare Theater's education department to St. Mark's for students in Gr. 6-8. Each grade previously studies one of Shakespeare's plays (Macbeth, Julius Caesar, Romeo and Juliet), and then sees live performances directly in front of them in their classrooms, role played, and discussed in depth. Not to be left out, students in Grades Pre-K through Grade 5 will experience a few days devoted to artistry with a visit from artist George Woideck. Our 8th Grade students will be spending a day learning how to provide CPR, use an AED, and provide basic first aid.

Catholic Education provides academic excellence in a faith-filled environment. Our children are expected to not only grow academically but to make contributions to our Church, our community, and our world. We are blessed to have a faculty who dedicates themselves to the successful growth of each individual child. They are a faith-filled group of professional men and women who work countless hours beyond the school day. We are blessed to have Fr. Adam, who supports our school and all my endeavors- even some of the crazy ones! I am personally blessed to have an assistant principal this year, Mrs. Christine Gunn, who goes above and beyond all expectations in helping me execute so many of my ideas! (I am pretty sure I drive her nuts at times!) And finally, we are also blessed to have support from you, our parish community. Your support allows us the opportunity to be a school of "Faith, Excellence, and Service". May God bless you and thank you for your unwavering support. Enjoy Catholic Schools' Week 2023!




