




Fall 2022 Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion Formation Sessions



PRINCIPAL NEWS

This past week, students in PreK- Gr. 5 listened to presentations from the Ohio Optometric Association regarding their eyes. PreK and Kindergarten watched Sammy Safe- Eyes while students in Gr. 1 and 2 were listening to a presentation called the Adventures of Rhet and Tina. Not to be left out, the students in Gr. 3-5 were also listening to the Case of Vinny Vision. Following these presentations, I asked the students to share some important facts they learned:

- Jack C. "I learned we can use sunglasses to take care of our eyes."
- Allie L. "I learned that we can go to the eye doctor to take care of our eyes."
- Arthur L: "The iris of your eye can be blue, green, gray, or brown."
- Ada P. "You should wear goggles when you are swimming to protect your eyes from chlorine."
- Harmony L. "Our eyebrows help our faces show expression."
- Paddy E. "Your pupils get bigger or smaller as the light changes."
- Cora W. "Your eye is a muscle."
- Margaret M. "Go to the eye doctor once a year."
- Nora S. "Eyelashes are good for your eyes."
- Eli S. "We have pupils in our eyes. If the room is bright, they become little. If the room is dark, they become larger."
- Harlowe O. "The images that we see are upside down, but our brains turn them right side up."
- Luke M. "If your eyes are blurry, you need to go to the eye doctor."
- Leo D." Glasses have certain kinds of lenses that help different kinds of people see."
- Ian R." Color-blind people need certain types of glasses."

We also invited Dr. James Knight to speak to our students in Gr. 6-8 last week. Dr. Knight is the author of the book Heart: A Journey Toward Cultural Humility.

According to Dr. Knight, "Cultural Humility is having a humble and respectful attitude toward others, especially those who are different from you." Here are a few key points he addressed during his talk with the students:

- It is important that each one of us makes our world a better place by living humbly because everybody wants to be heard, loved,, and supported
- People come from different walks of life but share common feelings
- Our words have power
- You are valuable
- God gives us opportunities throughout our lives. What are you going to do with them?

Again, I asked the students to share some takeaways from Dr. Knight's talk. Here are a few:

- Elyse R. "To overcome stereotypes, you have to go out of your comfort zone. You have to make new friends to see that no one is the same, so we can't just put them into boxes."
- Joe S. "People often make assumptions of what you are from the outside before they see what you are actually on the inside."
- Madeline G. "We are all made in God's image, so we are all what God wants us to be."
- Angelica Z. "When Dr. Knight pulled out the \$100 bill, he crumbled it up, stepped on it, but everyone still wanted it
 because it was still worth \$100. Everyone is worth something for whoever they are."
- Mahleah W. "Everyone wants to feel loved and understood."
- Evan L. "Stereotypes have a much larger effect on people's lives.. This opened my eyes a little more and showed me the bigger picture."
- Teagan S. "I think it is important to remember that just a single word can impact and tear down a person's
 confidence and pride in themselves."

Some of the students were so moved by Dr. Knight, they wanted to write him notes of thanks. Here are some of what they shared with Dr. Knight:

- Danny: "After your speech, I thought about what you said. I will be more careful about what I say because it might
 hurt others."
- Rocco: "Thank you for the kindness that you spread."
- Richard: "I can stop stereotyping others by just learning about them more."
- Cami: "It was cool to learn how you spread your message to professional athletes and teams. This shows that not
 only people my age need to learn to work together, but everyone. Your message spoke to me. Thank you for
 sharing."
- Lauren: "Your talk showed me how powerful our words, thoughts, and actions can be. Our world needs more respect; we can start right at St. Mark's."
- Erin: "You sharing your journey about not judging people has made my journey very strong. Thank you for your presentation."

This was yet another great week at St. Mark's. A special thanks to our Parent Club for making Dr. Knight's visit possible with their support. Our children thoroughly enjoyed his presentation.
